

Michael V. Campbell's Biography

Michael V. Campbell is Counsel in the Bank Supervision and Markets Division at the Federal Reserve Bank of New York. His areas of responsibility cover bank and bank holding company regulation, consumer law, privacy law and corporate governance.

Mr. Campbell has spoken at numerous conferences on financial regulatory topics including functional regulation under the Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act, merchant banking investments by financial holding companies, the Federal Reserve's role as umbrella supervisor, duties of directors of banks and bank holding companies, consumer protection rules for the sale of insurance products through banks, rules governing disclosure of consumer information under the Fair Credit Reporting Act and the Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act and federal breach notification rules for financial institutions. Mr. Campbell was responsible for organizing the Privacy Law Group, an independent body sponsored by the Federal Reserve Bank of New York that serves as a forum for discussing privacy-related matters.
